Your generosity touches a lot of lives. Michael's is unforgettable.

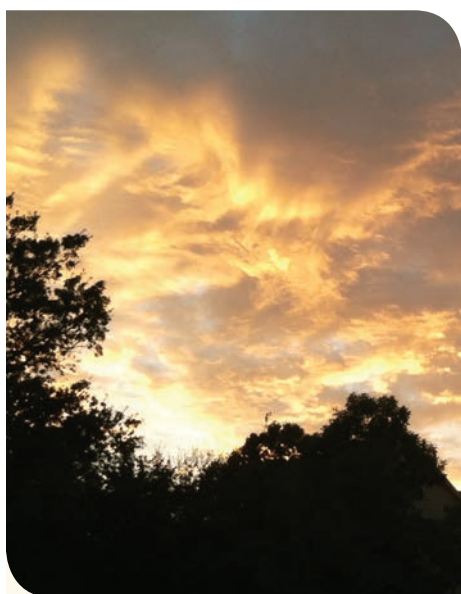

\$6 million dollar campaign helps 500 more patients a year!

You stepped up to support our Power of 10 campaign to add 10 new rooms to the William M. Dunlap Center for Caring, our Hospice Home off Trinity Road in Wake County, and we cannot thank you enough. Ten may sound like a small number, but it means that we'll be able to welcome 500 additional patients a year to our Hospice Home and increase our ability to manage medically-complex patients. This exciting expansion increases our facility's 20 rooms to a total of 30. We broke ground for the additions to our patient wings this spring and recently started construction.

- Four rooms enhanced to manage patients with cognitive impairment
- Two rooms specifically designed for bariatric patients
- An additional family room to provide a home-life family space
